Plants are considered domesticated when their life cycle, behavior, or appearance has been significantly altered as a result of being under artificial selection by humans for multiple generations (see the main article on domestication for more information). Thousands of distinct plant species have been domesticated throughout human history.

Since only certain plants are being selected and propagated, domestication tends to decrease the genetic diversity of the cultivated varieties of crops (see Figure below). Because consumers prefer uniformity in the marketplace, they “select” for low genetic diversity. But low genetic diversity can be detrimental (see later section).

The domestication of plants and animals was a major cultural innovation ranked in importance with the conquest of fire, the manufacturing of tools, and the development of verbal language. Charles Darwin recognized the small number of traits that made domestic species different from their wild ancestors.
