Reasoning about and making sense of statistics and probability are essential to students' future success. This volume belongs to a series that supports NCTM's *Focus in High School Mathematics: Reasoning and Sense Making* by providing additional guidance for making reasoning and sense making part of the mathematics experiences of all high school students every day. Six investigations illustrate how to help high school students develop their skills in working with data.
